

Appointments

Parents are **not allowed** to take children out of school early if it isn't their appointment. We would appreciate it if you arranged any appointments out of school hours, as it can affect your child's education. Please provide school with 48 hours notice, where possible, for appointments during school time. Please be advised that no child will be allowed out of school without proof of an appointment.

School Attendance

It is very important that your child attends school, if you take extended leave with your child during the school term you may lose your place at the school. Please ensure that holidays are taken out of school time and do not impact on your child's attendance or learning opportunities. You may also be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice. Holiday request forms are available from the office. Please note NO term time holidays will be authorised.

Pupil Medication

If your child is prescribed medication from the GP and needs to have it during school hours, please bring it to the school office and complete a medication form for it to be administered.

School Meals

Please ensure you let the office know at least 2 weeks before you change your child's lunch choice e.g. from packed lunch to school dinners. School dinners are £2.30 per day (£11.50 week). Money to be paid on a Monday and put in an envelope with your child's name, class and amount. Thank you.

Absence

Can you please let the school know before 9.00am on the morning of your child's absence. If you call the school on 01254 703440 you can leave a message, leaving the child's name, date, class and the reason for absence.

Late Arrival

School doors close at 9.00am. If you are late please report to the main office where you will be marked in and let into class. Please try to arrive on time as this can cause distress to your child. Thank you.

Money in School

Can any money being sent to school please be in an envelope clearly marked with the child's name, class and what the money is for and the amount. Money must be handed into the main office and not the class teacher. Thank you.

Head lice and nits



Head lice and nits are very common in young children and their families. They do not have anything to do with dirty hair and are picked up by head -to-head contact. You can treat head lice without visiting your GP.

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice.

Lice and nits can be removed by wet combing. You should try this method first. You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (Nitty Gritty are very effective) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits.

Please can we remind children about crossing roads safely, not running between parked cars or playing in the roads.

Is your child too ill for school?



Find below some advice from the NHS website regarding minor illnesses.

If your child has any of these symptoms they should be well enough to attend school and not miss any valuable learning.

Cold sores

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have a cold sore.

Encourage them not to touch the blister or kiss anyone while they have the cold sore, or to share things like cups and towels.

Conjunctivitis

You don't need to keep your child away from school if they have <u>conjunctivitis</u>. Do get advice from your pharmacist. Encourage your child to not rub their eyes and to wash their hands regularly.

Coughs and colds

It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or cold.

Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.

Hand, foot and mouth disease

If your child has <u>hand</u>, <u>foot and mouth disease</u> but seems well enough to go to school, there's no need to keep them off.

Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues straight away and to wash their hands regularly.

Head lice and nits

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice.

Ringworm

If your child has <u>ringworm</u>, see your pharmacist unless it's on their scalp, in which case you should see the GP.

It's fine for your child to go to school once they have started treatment.

Slapped cheek syndrome (fifth disease)

You don't need to keep your child off school if they have <u>slapped cheek syndrome</u> because once the rash appears, they're no longer infectious.

If you suspect your child has slapped cheek syndrome, take them to the GP and let school know if they're diagnosed with it.


UNIVERSAL FREE SCHOOL MEALS (UFSM)

AMAZING RESULTS FOR SUDELL REASONS TO BE PROUD!

As more information is produced by the DfE and BwD it is now possible for us to consider even more positively the **fantastic**KS2 achievements we had in 2019:

- Sudell is the <u>most improved</u> primary school at KS2 expected levels for Maths in Blackburn with Darwen
- Sudell has gone from 63rd (bottom school) for KS2 Maths outcomes in 2018 to 4th in Blackburn with Darwen in 2019
- Sudell is the <u>most improved</u> primary school for KS2 Reading at both the expected and higher levels in Blackburn with Darwen
- · Sudell had the <u>2nd biggest improvement</u> in KS2 higher standard in Writing (high), higher standard in Maths (high) and expected levels in GPS in Blackburn with Darwen
- Sudell had the <u>most improved</u> percentage of children achieving the higher standard for KS2 GPS in Blackburn with Darwen
- · Sudell had the <u>biggest average increase</u> in KS2 scaled scores for each of the Reading, Maths and GPS tests for Blackburn with Darwen
- Sudell had the <u>biggest year on year improvement</u> at KS2 in the
 percentage of pupils reaching the expected standard in Reading, Writing, and
 Maths in all of the Blackburn with Darwen schools from 2018 to 2019.
